Here are our objectives for the week of <u>April 17th:</u>

Reading

- I can follow agreed-upon rules for discussions.
- I can determine the main ideas and supporting details of a text.
- I can determine the meaning of words and phrases in a text, telling the difference between literal and nonliteral language.
- I can use sentence-level context as a clue to the meaning of a word or phrase.
- I can identify real-life connections between words and their use.
- I can ask and answer questions to demonstrate understanding of a text, referring explicitly to the text as the basis for the answers.
- I can recount myths from diverse cultures,.
- I can know and apply grade level phonics and decoding skills.
- I can decode words with common latin suffixes.
- I can decode multisyllable words.
- I can read on-level text with purpose and understanding

Writing/Language Arts

- I can write narratives to develop imagined experiences using descriptive details.
- I can use descriptions of actions, thoughts, and feelings to develop experiences and show the characters' responses to situations.
- I can determine or clarify the meaning of unknown a words and phrases , choosing flexibly from a range of strategies.

- I can use a known root word as a clue to the meaning of an unknown word with the same root.
- I can identify, form, and use comparative adjectives.
- I can proofread sentences for mechanics and usage errors.
- I can expand vocabulary by adding inflectional endings and suffixes.

Math Focus: Measurement

- I can explore estimating and measuring liquid volume using metric units of capacity.
- I can use the four operations to solve one-step word problems involving liquid volume.
- I can explore estimating and measuring units of mass.
- I can use the four operations to solve one-step word problems involving mass.
- I can tell time to the nearest minute.
