Here's The Plan for Next Week:

Reading

Readers will read multiple texts centered around the theme of food and feasts. They will take part in many activities relating to point of view, determining the moral of the story, and using context clues to figure out the meaning of unfamiliar words.

<u>Writing and Science</u>

Students will use the next few weeks to research their Big Zoo animal. They will research their animal's adaptations, diet, life cycle, and habitat. They will gather information from print and digital sources with a partner, and turn their organized notes into a written report.

Grammar and Spelling

Students will work on identifying action verbs and using commas in addresses. Our spelling words will focus on -or and -ar chunks.
