Here's The Plan for Next Week:

<u>Reading</u>

Readers will read multiple texts centered around the theme of being a writer and author. They will focus on determining the author's purpose of a text, conveyed through key details.

<u>Writing</u>

Writers will begin the week by completing their My Pet Monster narrative stories. They will edit, revise, and illustrate these. When this is complete, they will begin researching for an animal research project. This will be the same animal that they will study at our Big Zoo Lesson.

Grammar and Spelling

Students will focus on writing compound sentences by combining the subject or predicate nouns. Our spelling words will focus on beginning silent letter combinations, gn, kn, and wr.

Third graders have an exciting opportunity to attend The Big Zoo lesson at Potter Park Zoo this winter. This experience includes investigations, behind-the-scene tours, presentations by community experts, and groups of students working cooperatively on research.
